Through January, we ran a series of Biomechanic workshops with Ali Lane. Members had a chance to work in a small group, looking at posture, balance and exercises that can be done off the horse to improve both.

Once sat on your saddle, Ali encouraged everyone to find the position they felt most comfortable in, then took pho-

tos. This was followed by work on pelvis, ribs and head to create a straighter line through the body. Then it was off the 'horse' and work began on some 'releases'

to encourage tight areas to relax. Sitting on spiky balls, balancing on squishy, circular cushions and lying on foam rollers, all helped the members to feel which part of their bodies needed work. Then it was back onto the saddle for more work. A second round of photos followed, with Ali discussing the before and after positions with each rider.



The sessions were fun, relaxed and a good introduction to the subject. We'll have further workshops later on the year, both on and off the horse, so watch this space

- 5. Finally, wait for the results.

Points can be gained when competing in show jumping at 60cm or 70cm, or dressage in a walk & trot or prelim test. There will be two separate leagues, show jumping and dressage lopen to both senior & junior riders). Monthly score updates will be provided; therefore senior is junior rivers). Informiny score updates will be provided; therefore competitors must return their score card to the BRC head office no later than the 7th of the following month. Results on cards received after this time will not count. The competition will run for ten months from January — October 2017, there will be rosettes down to 10th place, sashes down to 3rd and there will be an overall supreme champion prize for the competitor who has accumulated the most points over the two leagues.



there are some rule changes for 2018 that all members need to be aware of

The Mercian group was set up back in 1984 between a number of clubs that were roughly situated along the M5/M50 corridor. At the time, it was felt that BRC Area competitions started at too high a level for the average grass roots rider, so the group set up inter-club team events for it's senior riders, which began at a lower level.

28 years later and BRC is a slightly different beast! With jumping qualifiers now starting at 70cm and Intro tests at the Championships, it was felt by the group that the Area events are now better equipped to encourage riders at that level. Horse and Rider combinations were competing at both Area and Mercian events, which has moved away from the original aims of setting it up.

Therefore, from 2018, all jumping competitions will be at 60cm and 70cm only. Dressage will be at Intro and Prelim, and the Novice test has been dropped. This is a huge change, but the idea is to foster some confidence in the true novice rider and encourage them to have a go before moving on up to Area.

As a member, you can still compete at both levels, but once a Horse & Rider combination have competed at Area, they will no longer be able to 'step backwards' to do a Mercian competition at a lower level IN THE SAME DISCIPLINE.

Mercian Show Jumping. But they could do any of the other disci-

With Mercian competitions, eligibility is nearly always decided on the Horse and Rider combination. However, if the HORSE has been placed 1st to 6th in an Area qualifier in the past year, or 1st to 3rd at a BRC Championship in the past 3 years, then they are not eligible at that discipline either, no matter who is riding them.

The good news is that there is now a 'downgrading' system in place. If you feel, for whatever reason, that you and your horse need to step down a level, then your case can be put to the Mercian committee. On the whole, if there is a genuine reason for doing so, you will be able to compete. You need to discuss this with Jodie, our Mercian Manager, before putting your name down. At the end of the day, the Mercian competitions are supposed to be fun and relaxed, a nice introduction to team events for our grassroots riders, and a chance to get out with our young horses.

A full list of the 2018 Mercian Rules and Eligibility will be added to our website shortly under 'Teams and Leagues' - it's worth while having a read before the season begins.

Other news is that the league itself will change, with more trophies and prizes on offer for clubs that do well. There will also be a trophy awarded to the Mercian Individual of the Year, which will be nominated from each club. So even more reason to have a go this year!

On 6th March, Charlie from Treehouse Sporting Colours presented a fun and informative talk on safety equipment. The company was set up in 1998 and at first only dealt in funky colours for XC and race riders, but over the years, Charlie's interest in innovations to

hat, body protector and other safety ware, has seen the company branch out in other directions.

Riding hats were the first topic of conversation and Charlie pointed out that it is the air bubbles in the polystyrene that saves you. A hat just sitting on a shelf, never being used, will lose this air eventually, so even without a fall, its recommended that you change your hat every 3 to 4 years. Storage is very important - extreme heat or cold can cause this air to escape, as can moisture (think of those sweaty heads after a hard training session!), so ideally hats should be air dried and kept in the house. When fitting a hat, there should be a nice vacuum and no gapping. There is a lot more variation in hat shape these days, so its actually easier to find something to suit everyone.

Body Protectors and Air Jackets were next up, and with the change to BRC rulings on standards for this year, everyone was keen to find out what was available. Again, there was a discussion on fitting and how important it is to try sitting in a saddle before you purchase. Some hilarity was caused when the 'Ladies Cut' was discussed, but due to popular belief, this is less to do with the, ahem,

chest area, but is actually shaped around the bottom to fit better around the hips. Charlie also offered some advice on storage and cleaning, before moving onto air jackets. These provide a dynamic protection, rather than the static protection offered by body protectors. They cushion neck, hip joints and lower back in the event of a fall, not all of which will be covered by a body



protector. A word of caution was also given, reminding everyone that these are mechanical, so do have a small failure rate—however many of these incidences are caused by rider error in fixing the air canister, rather than the jacket itself. And of course, the evening wouldn't be the same without a demonstration of one going off!

Throughout the talk, Charlie kept us very entertained with anecdotes from his many years of working in the horsey industry, as well as some history behind the products he has on offer. He came across as very passionate about what he does and encouraged everyone to come and look over his stock.

The evening ended with some lovely refreshments and many members took advantage of the generous discounts on offer to purchase new hats and body protectors for the coming season.

It was Bewdley RC's first go at running at this and on the whole it all went brilliantly. The competition involved a round of show-


jumps, then straight out onto the lovely crosscountry course, where riders tackled a variety of jumps including the quarry, ditches and the water.
