Schedule

Class One: 70cm Teams and Individuals. Single phase. Open to all.

Class Two: 80cm Teams and Individuals. Single phase Open to all.

This class includes a preliminary round for the Spring Festival Debut Class - the top five eligible combinations may enter and ride in Class Three (the Debut Area competition) - please state on your entry that you are eligible and would like to be included as a preliminary round combination and that if you qualify you will pay the Class Three entry fee in cash on the day to the Show Secretary to compete; the Area class is only for those riders who are Members of a Branch/Centre in Area 9

Class Three: PC Debut SF Area competition - 85cm. Table A7.

Number of competitors to qualify for the Championships = 7. This class is only for those combinations which have qualified at a preliminary round and are listed on the main PC website plus those qualified on the show day.

Class Four: 90cm Teams and Individuals. Single phase. Open to all.

This class includes a preliminary round for the Spring Festival PC Challenge Class - the top five eligible combinations may enter and ride in Class Five (the PC Challenge Area competition) - please state on your entry that you are eligible and would like to be included as a preliminary round combination and that if you qualify you will pay the Class Five entry fee in cash on the day to the Show Secretary to compete; the Area class is only for those riders who are Members of a Branch/Centre in Area 9

Class Five: PC Challenge SF Area competition - 95cm. Table A7.

Number of competitors to qualify for the Championships = 7. This class is only for those combinations which have qualified at a preliminary round and are listed on the main PC website plus those qualified on the show day.

Class Six: 100cm Teams and Individuals. Single phase open to all.

Class Seven: 1.10m class. Individuals only. Table A7. Open to all,

Area 9 members are eligible to qualify for the Open Grand Prix class at the Spring Festival Championships - please state on your entry if you want to enter the Spring Festival Grand Prix section; the first four will qualify for the Championships (if more than 15 starters in the section then five will qualify). Combinations have to complete the round one (ie not eliminated or retired) to be able to qualify.

Entries: Classes 1,2,4 & 6 £15 Classes 3, 5 & 7 £18

Rosettes: 1st to 8th individual in all classes. 1st to 6th for teams

Competitors must print off or make their own numbers and use a number bib. Please make the numbers as clear as possible. All competitors must use a padded whip as per the rule and all Pony Club members must have a tagged hat.

If you would like to edit your horse or rider details before the closing date of the event please login to your Horse Events account and edit your booking under the 'MY BOOKING' Tab

Results will be published on the secretaries table after each class and the prize giving will be half an hour after the results have been published.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

PASSPORTS: Horses/ponies will not be allowed to compete without their passport with valid flu vaccinations – **Members of the Pony Club:** your DC/Centre Proprietor will be emailed to confirm that your pony/horse's flu vaccination record has been checked and conforms to PC rules. If you are NOT a PC Member, please scan your pony/horse's passport (name page and all pages of the flu vaccination record) and email to Sarah Bowness by 28th November for checking. **Passports will be spot checked for compliance. A horse with a non-compliant passport will NOT be allowed to compete (nor will any horses travelling in the same trailer/lorry) and there will be no refund of entry. Please allow time for passport checking. NUMBERS: rider numbers must be printed out by each competitor – if wearing a number bib please wear front and back. If the number is to be put on the saddlecloth – please do A5 size and wear both sides. If the number is to be worn on the back of the rider, then please print at least A5 size. Numbers to be printed/written as large as possible in dark ink please. *Please do NOT use bridle numbers. ***

2. Teams to be made up of 3 or 4 combinations, with the best three scores to count. Mixed teams will be made up from Individuals.
3. Substitutions allowed – please tell the Secretary (Entries before the day, Show on the day) or the Judges (if no Secretary on the day).
4. The Organisers reserve the right to refuse entry, alter the order of the classes, cancel classes and/or limit entries.
5. Pre-entries are essential as entries will be limited. If you miss the closing date, please email the Entries Secretary for available spaces. A waiting list will be held if necessary.
6. Closing date for entries – Monday 28th November 2022. Withdrawal refunds, after the closing date will only be given on receipt of a relevant doctor/vet certificate received by the Entries Secretary by 2nd November 2022
7. If the show is cancelled due to circumstances beyond our control, entry fees will be refunded. ALL refunds will be subject to an administration fee.
8. TIMES/DRAWN ORDERS WILL BE GIVEN – please see the Ledbury Hunt P.C. website from Thursday 2nd November (evening). Competitors may be asked to jump before their drawn order time – please be ready.
9. There will be a steward to do the jumps in the jump warm-up and the warm up will be limited to 6 riders warming up at one time.. Only competitors and stewards may be in the warm-up arenas.
10. Each horse/pony may only jump once in each class and in a maximum of three classes. Stallions are allowed with prior permission from the Entries Secretary; any stallion ridden by a Pony Club member must have written permission from their DC/Centre Proprietor which must be sent to the Entries Secretary prior to the show day. Stallions must wear stallion discs and ribbons. All horse/ponies must be at least 5 years old on day of competition.
11. Turnout for ALL Pony Club members and horses should be as in the Pony Club Rules for Show-jumping 2022. Rules available on the main Pony Club website.
12. SPURS: ALL spurs worn anywhere on the showground, by any competitor, must comply with Pony Club rules. Misuse of spurs by any competitor will be recorded and reported and may result in disqualification from the competition.
13. Any abuse of horses/ponies, officials, other competitors or members of the public will not be tolerated and those found doing so will be asked to leave the venue with no compensation and may be reported to the relevant authority.
14. Judges' decision is final. Any objection must be handed to the Judges Box in writing with a £30 deposit (which will be forfeited if the objection is not upheld) within 15 minutes of the incident and BEFORE the end of that class.
15. INSURANCE: please ensure that you have adequate/appropriate insurance for rider, horse, property and third party.

16. PHOTOGRAPHS: by entering this competition you are agreeing to be photographed whilst competing; these photographs may be used for future publicity. If you do not wish to be photographed please tell the photographer on entering the arena before you jump.
17. Participants attend at their own risk; neither the Committee nor Hartpury University will be liable for any loss, damage or accident to horses, riders, property, or other persons.
18. No horses/ponies may be left tied to the outside of trailers/lorries without supervision. Please clear any muck/rubbish and do not leave on the field/lorry park. Please park cars as directed (usually in the lower car park) – not by the lorries. Please be aware that there is no gate between the lorry park and the main road.
19. Dogs – must always be kept on a short lead and be under close control . Please clear up after your dog.
20. The show will be run under The Pony Club Show jumping Rules 2022

DISCLAIMERS
