GENERAL RULES: ENTRIES

1. All competitions are open to any member of an Affiliated riding club within the Mercian Inter-Club League. However only a maximum of 2 junior riders are permitted on a team.
2. Riders may ride for more than one club during the Mercian season, but not for different clubs on the same day.
3. No horse may compete at different levels on the same day.
4. Where open classes are run on the same day and a rider has entered the same height/test as their Mercian entry, they must ride their Mercian entry first.
5. Horses must be entered under the name on their passport.
6. There are no restrictions on horses height, but all horses must be 4 years or over.
7. A club may enter as many teams as they wish into a competition, subject to rule 26.
8. All entries must be made by the closing date of the competition. Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the organising club.
9. Any changes to teams, riders or horses after an entry has been submitted, must be communicated to the organiser as soon as possible. Any changes on the day are taken at the organisers discretion and must be presented to the secretary at least 30 mins before the start of the class.
10. Unless otherwise stated, all competitions are for teams of four, with the best three scores to count.
11. Individuals from Mercian clubs may be entered into Mercian classes and are eligible for any individual rosettes. No points will be earned towards the Mercian League.
12. If a club is struggling to put together a team, they may join with another Mercian club to enter a mixed team. Points earned will be split equally between the two clubs, irrespective of how many members from each club are on the team.
13. All competitions are run under current BRC rules, except where superseded by specific rules below.

ELIGIBILITY

14. All Horse/Rider Combinations should compete at one of 4 'levels' (see appendix 1); these have been created to make sure that riders are competing against people of the same standard.
15. Combinations may ride at a different level for jumping and for dressage classes.
16. A horse and rider combination competing at Area level cannot compete at a lower level at a Mercian competition, unless they have been downgraded (see rule 18).
17. While every effort has been made to cover all eventualities within appendix 1, where there are shortcomings, team managers are asked to make entries in the spirit of the Mercian Group principles.
18. If a team manager wishes to officially downgrade a member, they must put the case in writing to the Mercian

- Chair, who will review the case. The case must be presented at least a month before the closing date of the desired competition. The Chair's decision will be final, but can be re-presented the following year on appeal.
19. The minimum penalty for entering non-eligible members is to have the points from that competition deducted from the league. Further penalties may be imposed if the club is found to be constantly breaking the eligibility rules. All penalties are at the discretion of the Mercian committee.

RUNNING A COMPETITION

20. Any club wishing to run a competition within the league must put forward their proposals at the annual AGM held in the preceding year.
21. A competition may be organised in any ridden discipline, but only one competition per discipline should happen during the year.
22. The competition should be inclusive for all members, but where space or time is a factor, it must cover a minimum of two Mercian Levels.
23. Organisers may choose to run their competition so that all members of a team compete at the same level or so that all members in the team compete at a different level. The format must be clearly printed on the schedule.
24. Final dates must be confirmed and related to the Mercian Secretary before April 1st. Any dates confirmed after this, **MUST** be discussed with the Chair before schedules are finalised to ensure that no dates clash.
25. Where possible, Mercian events should not clash with BRC Area Qualifiers (NB. This effects Area 5, 9, 15 and 18 - the Mercian secretary will keep a list of dates as reference) and Championships.
26. An organising club may restrict the number of teams entered per club if limited by time or space at the venue. However, if spaces subsequently become available, then these must be offered to the clubs already entered on an equal basis.
27. Rosettes **MUST** be awarded 1st to 6th (minimum) on the day to all team and individual places.
28. Schedules must be sent to the Mercian Secretary at least 1 month before the closing date of entries. Schedules will be distributed to all Team Managers on receipt.
29. A full copy of the results must be sent to the Mercian Secretary within a week of the competition.

SCORING

32. All team places are calculated using the individual arena placings of the all team members.
33. In each arena or section, the winner earns one point, 2nd place 2 points and so on down the rankings. Every competitor therefore 'earns' a score unless disqualified.
34. The team with the lowest overall score will be declared the winner.
35. Exceptions to the above:
- ◆ Dressage to Music: This is on teams of 3, all scores to count. The three percentages are added together and the team with the highest score wins.
 - ◆ Quiz: The team with the highest score wins. The organisers may run a tie-break round to separate teams on the same score.
36. ODE and Hunter Trials: there should only be a short timed section. This time is only used to decide places in the event of a tie.
37. Showing: in the event of a tie, the team placed highest in the Riding Club class is placed higher.

SPECIFIC COMPETITION RULES

38. **COMBINED TRAINING:** This is to be a two phase event, including dressage and show-jumping. Classes may be run as two riders per level in each team (as per BRC) or with all four team members in the same level.
39. **DRESSAGE:** Any current British Dressage or BRC test may be used.
40. **DRESSAGE TO MUSIC:** Tests as per current British Dressage Freestyle tests. Teams of three that can be made up of any combination of tests being run in the day, with all three scores to count. Arenas can be 40m x 20m

or 60m x 20m at the organisers discretion.

41. **EVENTER CHALLENGE / TWO PHASE / ARENA EVENTING:** This will be a two phase event, including show jumping and cross-country. The two phases may run concurrently or riders may be given separate times for both phases.
42. **SHOWING:** One member in each team to ride in a different class.
Class: Riding Club Horse (horse must be in a snaffle bridle and will be expected to jump a single fence)
Class: Veteran Horse (horse or pony to be 17 years or over)
Class: Working Hunter (to jump a course of rustic fences)
Class: Coloured (open to piebald, skewbald, tri-coloured, dun, palomino, spotted or cremello)
44. **SHOW JUMPING:** May be run as single phase or two phase at the organiser's discretion.
45. **QUIZ:** All members of the Quiz team MUST be members of the club. The organising club can choose format, however, it usually consists off approximately 10 rounds and has a least one horse related round.

POINTS LEAGUE

46. Points are awarded as follows: 1st = 8 points; 2nd = 7 points; 3rd = 6 points; 4th = 5 points; 5th = 4 points; 6th = 3 points. Any unplaced teams that participates = 1 point.
47. While a club may enter as many teams as they like in each class (subject to previous rules), only the two highest placed teams will be awarded 'place' points (ie. for 1st to 6th). Any further teams that are placed for that club in that class will only earn 1 participation point. Place points will then be awarded to the next placed team from a different club.
48. The OVERALL league will be calculated on the 6 best places earned by each club. (for example, a club that wins 6 classes in the year will be placed above a club that wins 5 and comes 2nd in one).
49. In the event of a tie, the 7th best place will be taken into account, then the 8th, and so on down the line until the tie is broken, or one of the clubs involved does not have another score.
50. A separate FLATWORK league will be calculated as per rule 46 to 50, but only covers points won at Dressage, Dressage to Music, Showing and the Quiz.
51. A separate JUMPING league will be calculated as per rule 46 to 50, but only covers points won at Show Jumping, Style Jumping and Hunter Trials.
52. A separate COMBINED league will be calculated as per rule 46 to 50, but only covers points won at Combined Training, One-Day-Event, Eventer Challenge and Two Phase Competitions.

RIDER OF THE YEAR

54. Every club competing in the 2019 League will be invited to nominate a Rider of the Year.
55. The nominated Rider must be a member of the club and must have competed in at least one Mercian event.
56. Nominations will be returned to the Mercian Secretary, who will anonymise the write-ups.
57. Each club competing the 2019 League will then be able to vote on all the nominated riders. Each club will have one vote, which must be returned to the Mercian Secretary on the official form.

NB. Horse and Rider Combinations may ride at different levels for Dressage and for Jumping Classes. When entering a Combined Event, they can enter either of the levels for the single sport. For example, a rider that competes at Prelim Dressage (Level 2) but has a go at the 60cm SJ (Level 1), could enter a Combined Training at either Level 1 or 2, whichever they feel comfortable at.
